America's chocolate companies were given an early Valentine's Day gift when in September 2015 the Third Circuit Court of Appeals vacated a lawsuit filed against them for conspiracy to implement price increases. Find and cite the opinion that vacated the lawsuit in favor of the chocolate companies.

- 1. Sign into Lexis Advance.
- 2. Select Search: Everything on the search bar.
- 3. Under Jurisdiction, select Third Circuit.
- Under Category, select Cases.
- Run the following search: antitrust and chocolate and conspiracy.
- 6. Use the *Timeline* on the left to filter your results by date: September 1, 2015 September 30, 2015.



In 2009, Mrs. Davis filed for divorce alleging that her husband refused to acknowledge Valentine's Day and otherwise ignored her. Although failing to get your significant other chocolates on Valentine's Day is not advised, the New York Appellate Division Second Department ruled that this type of social abandonment was not a ground for divorce. - In the search bar at the top, run the following search: annulment and jest and dare.


